

# Importance of industry



 The sector is important to coastal areas, particularly in Scotland (where fish accounts for 3% of exports), Wales, Northern Ireland, North East and South West England


# What the Fisheries Minister has said:

We are also committed to continued co-operation with other countries over the management of shared stocks."
