


- 20 Years Ago....at Coastal Futures 1994....
 - Initial Trails had begun and the NRA had identified a new experimental site at Tollesbury;
 - The logical rationale for 'managed retreat' was well understood:
 - Reduced maintenance costs for coastal defence;
 - Space for sea level rise (addressing coastal squeeze);
 - Creating 'new' intertidal habitats;
 - Ideally creating more sustainable shorelines and estuaries.





• The Future ... is not short of more challenges


- Work to Do To meet SMPs aims by 2050 realignment needs to increase 5-fold from 6km/year to 30km/year;
- **Cost** Increasing cost of project; even as projects get larger there are no economies of scale....
- Land Purchase Problems with securing correct land;
- What are the incentives/funds: Other than Habitats Regulations...WFD, Biodiversity offsetting, aquaculture? need to think bigger...
- **Communicating Project Rationale** A challenge for all projects; raising issues such as food security....need to clarify the multiple benefits...
