

Monitoring update

- We monitor adopted marine plans, supporting ongoing improvement
- Statutory requirement to monitor and report to Parliament on a 3-yearly basis for each adopted marine plan
- The reports present a wide range of data, including from annual surveys
- Monitoring surveys 2019:
 - Two: one South, and one East
 - Online, mobile and tablet-friendly format, takes around 15 mins
 - Live until this Friday 25 January: take part, and tell us your views!



Key Milestones	Date
Approval of Statement of Public Participation (SPP)	June 2016
Call for issues with supporting evidence	July 2016
Engagement on the first products - Iteration 1	Spring 2017
Engagement on the second products - Iteration 2	Spring 2018
Engagement on the third products - Iteration 3	Spring 2019
Secretary of State approves draft marine plans prior to consultation	Autumn 2019
Public consultation starts (for 14 weeks)	Winter 2019/2020
Secretary of State approves final marine plans for adoption -	
SW, SE, NW, NE	Autumn 2020
Publish adopted marine plans	Winter 2020



Digital marine planning

Alpha Phase completed November 2018

- Building on the outputs of the Discovery Phase, analysis of user needs and creation of prototypes
- Continued user research, using prototypes to refine the final product to be developed
- Final proposal for the new digital marine planning system
- Beta phase (timing TBC) system developed



External decision making and implementation mapping of marine plans

Findings

- Identified relevant parties and decisions
 - Government departments 7
 - Agencies and other public bodies 22
 - Relevant decisions 59
- All respondents (14 organisations) use marine plans to inform decisions
- Categorised decisions into 7 types e.g. management measures
- Established process diagrams for each decision category, supporting implementation

Recommendations

- Clearer communication of report finding to support consenting and permitting processes
- Closer engagement with government departments



Enhancing stakeholder engagement

2 Phases



I. Investigate stakeholder...

- ...awareness, understanding, experience and views of past communication and engagement
- ...drivers, motivations and ability to engage in current and future contexts.

2. Work with coastal partnerships to...

- ...test current and newly proposed techniques to reach a wider audience more effectively
- ...test current and newly proposed techniques to work collaboratively and more effectively across borders.



South West Partnership for Environment and Economic Prosperity

- 5-year NERC-funded programme, led by UoE, UoP, PML, with a suite of impact projects
- One impact project is a collaboration between PML and the MMO, focusing on climate change model predictions for the SW marine plan area from 2021 to 2041 for variables including temperature, pH, chlorophyll
- Modelling expertise provided by PML data and draft report under review
- Outputs will inform development of the SW marine plan






