

Bursaries

As part of <u>our commitment</u> to encouraging and supporting diversity, equity and inclusion, we are launching our third Coastal Futures Bursary to amplify the voices of young people in UK marine decision-making.

The opportunity is open for young people aged 18 to 25 years old, who are from groups that are currently under-represented in the marine and coastal sector and face financial barriers to attending.

The bursary scheme has been supported for the past two years by the Esmée Fairbairn Foundation and OCF, and we are offering sponsors the opportunity to be part of a sustainable future for the bursary. Your support for the bursary will be acknowledged at the event and in the run up to the conference.

Our application process is open until 7 November 2025 and we intend to provide twelve places – six in-person and six online.
